Birth Doula Studies - Online Certificate Program

Module 1 – The Doula as a Holistic Birth Practitioner

Course Description:

A Doula is a trusted birthing companion who provides physical, emotional, information and often spiritual support to a woman before, during and just after childbirth. As a doula, you draw upon your knowledge and experience to help provide the information necessary for your client to make informed choices throughout the birth process. This module is an introduction to the role of a doula. You will learn more about yourself and how you can use this self-knowledge to support your clients. In this module you will also learn about the scope of practice of a doula, how you can best support a woman in birth within your scope of practice, and how to assist your clients during the stages of natural birth as a member of the maternity care team.

Pre-requisites:

No academic prerequisites are required; however, students should

- Have basic experience with computers, word processing, and internet
- Have a genuine desire to support childbearing families
- Feel comfortable discussing all aspects of childbirth.

Birth Doula Studies Certificate:

If you are planning to complete the entire Birth Doula Studies program and earn your Continuing Education Certificate, you must complete ALL of the following:

- Modules 1, 2 & 3 of the online Birth Doula Studies program
- A minimum of 20 hours of practical volunteer experience (within 6 months of program start date)
